ON MARCH 12TH 1894, SIX GENTLEMEN FILED INTO THE OFFICES OF TWEEDIE BROTHERS AT 78 CORNHILL IN THE CITY OF LONDON FOR THE PURPOSES OF CONSIDERING THE FORMATION OF A LLOYD'S GOLF CLUB.



Whether the six were aware they were creating the first trade/company golf club in England will never be known. Similar clubs had been in existence in Edinburgh for some years and though owning neither course or clubhouse

they had always been known as golf clubs: the term "golf society" was not used until the turn of the century. Perhaps it is surprising that Lloyd's is still referred to as a "golf club". One Past President made the point that to be a club "appeared somewhat peculiar" when LGC did not have a course. The immediate Past President did not take to kindly to this and, to general approval, opined that the club "should continue to be peculiar". There the matter has rested and it is a matter of some pride that the term 'club' is still used.

One hundred and twenty years later LGC is thriving. We have over 600 members within the Society of Lloyd's, both active and retired. It is a fantastic opportunity to meet people across the Lloyd's community and play some fantastic courses in the UK.

All our golf is played as foursomes. We have three meetings a year at Walton Heath, Royal St. George's and the Berkshire. In addition to our meetings we play 27 matches a year against various golfing societies and clubs. Any member is eligible to play. For those members under the age of 35 the Club will sponsor their green fees.

The social highlight of the year is our annual dinner at the Merchant Taylor's Hall, held on the first Thursday in March. From the scrawled minutes taken in 1894 we now have our own website. The website shows you how you can join within the rules of the club.





INTERVIEW WITH MR MICHAEL BREEN; ARCHITECT, FOUNDER AND CEO OF P1 INTERNATIONAL – THE WORLD'S FIRST AND LEADING "SUPERCAR CLUB".

SO HOW DID P1 COME INTO EXISTENCE?

It all came about as a result of Damon suggesting that we should buy ourselves a couple of Ferraris from our local Ferrari dealer. The salesman told us the waiting list was 2 years at which point Damon Canary Wharf guys, they often work in a financial institution lost interest (although it could possibly also have been related to the price and wishing to maintain his reputation as the tightest man in F1). Anyway, I tried to reason with the salesman about the 2 year wait but he said very bluntly "Look you aren't Jay Kay, you aren't Eric Clapton and you aren't David Beckham and all the other celebs who get preference ahead of you so you will just have get in line with all the other captains of industry". As you can imagine this made me really guite cross. So at the next F1 race I had dinner with my friend Michele Sofisti the worldwide marketing director

> of Ferrari and after a couple of excellent bottles of Chianti he very kindly agreed to build an extra car for me which I got within 12 weeks. However, I just got lucky because I happened to work in F1 and I knew the Ferrari guys particularly well. So this got me thinking and after having discussed the whole issue of supercar ownership with some friends which ranged from the unsatisfactory buying experience and dealing with condescending salesmen to the mind numbingly painful depreciation. From this I decided that there had to be a much better way to access not just 1 but a whole fleet of supercars and from this P1 was born with Damon and myself being the Founders some 17 years ago.

TO WHOM IS THE CLUB AIMED?

We have male and female members and from all walks of life and all professions. However, in general our members are City/ but that is in addition to the golfers, chefs, comedians and rock stars. However I would stress that everyone is treated exactly the same. Most members already have at least one supercar but they like the idea of experiencing all the newest vehicles before buying. Some of our members are even lucky enough to be given a membership as a present by their Partner!

SO P1 HAS EXISTED NOW FOR OVER 17 YEARS – WHY THE ADDITION OF THE CANARY WHARF FACILITY?

Simple – we have noted a growing demand in Canary Wharf that we want to satisfy and it is just too remote to service professionally from our existing base in Esher, Surrey.

HOW MANY CARS DOES THE CLUB OWN CURRENTLY?

Currently we have 18 supercars.

IS THERE A LIST OF WHAT CARS MEMBERS CAN CURRENTLY DRIVE?

Yes it is in our online brochure which is available on request or from our website.

HOW MANY CARS CAN A MEMBER HOPE TO DRIVE?

I think realistically on our top Monaco membership it would roughly be 15 cars over 40 days which works out at a daily cost of £337.50 plus VAT. It's too cheap really but we are enthusiasts and it's genuinely not about the money.

PLEASE OUTLINE HOW THE CLUB WORKS?

Club memberships – There are 4 different levels of Membership to cover everyone's access requirements Monaco which can yield up to 40 days per year depending on the member's preferences, Monza which can yield 30 days per year, Spa which can yield 20 days per year and Singapore which can yield 12-14 days. Car categories – are grouped from 1 to 5 depending on cost, with group 5 representing the most expensive. Needless to say we have everything to suit all tastes from the Lamborghini Aventador SV and Huracan Spyder to the Ferrari 488 Spider. **Season and weekend versus weekday variation –** 2 seasons high (April to September) and low season (October to March) And Weekday use/points is just incredible value. Using a Group 3 with polishing up our skills every now and then. car such as an Audi R8 (second generation) V10 Plus or Bentley Continental GT Speed Convertible costs just 21 points on a low season weekday which equates to £283.50 plus Vat per day. It truly is spectacular value.

DO MEMBERS ALWAYS GET THE CAR THEY WANT?

Honestly NO not always as they are sharing each car with 6 other people however if they don't then the alternative is not so bad such HOW DOES SOMEONE JOIN? as a Lamborghini, Aston Martin, Bentley etc. Also to guarantee that a member can ensure he or she gets the specific car for certain events we have a Wildcard system which they can use up to 12 months ahead instead of the normal 30 days in advance booking rule so that birthdays, anniversaries etc. are all covered. The number of Wildcards per membership is dependent on the membership.

CAN YOU DESCRIBE HOW THE CLUB SELECTS WHICH CARS TO BUY?

Well that is the fun bit. It just depends on whether it is regarded as a truly great driver's car and if the members want it, we run the club democratically for the most part – we ask what members want.

WHAT DOES THE CLUB COVER?

Depreciation, insurance, servicing, tyres, clutches, brakes, all consumables and valeting. We also deliver and collect free of charge within central London.

WHAT ARE THE ECONOMICS OF P1 COMPARED WITH OWNERSHIP?

We are significantly cheaper and you can invest your hard earned cash instead, you get to drive an entire fleet of cars and you do not have the hassle of selling your car when the time to change comes. And did I mention that we get the cars at the same time as some leading Celebs!!

HOW DOES A MEMBER RECEIVE A CAR?

They can come to us but 85-90% of members have their supercar delivered either to home or work. We deliver and collect within central London free of charge

ARE THERE ANY OTHER MEMBERSHIPS BENEFITS?

One particular enjoyable benefit is a driver awareness course to make our members a better and safer driver. We can always do

SOUNDS TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE – THERE MUST BE SOME DOWN SIDES?

Not really to be honest. I designed the Club to satisfy the things that annoy and irritate me to ensure that it ticks all the boxes but maybe we should put our prices up as people keep asking me what the catch is because it is too cheap!

Usually just e-mail or phones up and we meet up with them to explain how it works and to ensure it is for them.

CAN ANYONE JOIN – IS IT THAT EXCLUSIVE?

Yes. Anyone can join as long as they are going to behave in a respectful way to our cars, staff and other members.



Michael, who hails from Belfast in Northern Ireland, graduated with a Law degree qualifying as a Solicitor in 1988. He practised as a corporate lawyer for 25 years with a niche in Sports Law and was a Partner in an international Law Firm in the City. He was renowned for his work in motorsport and

Formula 1 in particular. He has represented a whole list of household names in F1 and other sports from Stirling Moss to Damon Hill and was responsible for establishing the Grand Prix Drivers' Association in the early 1990s which brought him into direct conflict with Max Moseley and Bernie Ecclestone.





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ANALTERNATIVE LOOK AT THE WINE LIST

DAVID HUGHES OFFERS SOME GOOD-VALUED ADVICE

Great Events have cast long shadows into 2017 as the New Year awaits a Trump Presidency and the declaration of Article 50, the world of wine joins the rest of us as to what the various outcomes will be.

Obviously you, the reader, will taste the same wine differently from me, but after that, it is value for money that should always be the defining factor in your choice. This is particularly relevant since the pound has dropped in value against most of the major wine producing countries and this will obviously have an effect on price paid in this country.

And this is not going to get better sooner than later with, mainly frost and hail decimating many of France's prime regions in 2016 (parts of Chablis 60% loss, The Loire Valley also taking a beating) as have many other wine regions across Europe.

So where do we go if we seek 'fair value' for our depleted Pound?

The first rule of value is to avoid the famous names, seeking out quality villages close by or even the same grape variety produced many miles away – and I'll endeavour to give some thoughts in this respect as set out below:

LOIRE: SANCERRE AND POUILLY FUMÉ

Whilst already high, prices will be rising. Look for: Menetou-Salon, Quincy (France's second oldest AC) & Reuilly – all produce good, snappy Sauvignon Blanc.

NORTHERN RHÔNE

The Big Boys of the Syrah grape have things pretty much tied up and best value lies in the region's largest Appellation, Crozes-Hermitage and the rising St.-Peray.

SOUTHERN RHÔNE

This region's Grenache-driven AC has, over the past few years promoted a few villages up to the Premier League and you should look for Rasteau and Cairanne as well as improving Lirac, the Luberon and Côtes-du-Rhône bearing a good producer.

BORDEAUX

Escaping much of the inclement weather, Bordeaux's elite wines have been somewhat inflated by Chinese interests. For better value at the top end – look for the Second Wines of the great and famous otherwise try and seek out: Ch. Laroque (St-Emilion), Ch. La Pointe (Pomerol), Ch. De La Dauphine (Fronsac) & Ch. Biac (Cadillac).

BURGUNDY

Its smaller production always demands top dollar and with reduced recent vintages, look to the wines of the Côte Chalonnaise such as Givry, Rully and Mercurey. However, if the big players from the Côte de Nuits are your fancy, keep your fingers crossed for the stock market!

THE LANGUEDOC-ROUSSILLON

Here lies the greatest value that France has to offer; gone the days of being the 'wine lake', a recent 5-day visit proved to me this is an energised region producing stunning stuff – white, rosé and in particular reds from Faugères, La Clape and good Corbières and Minervois. You won't be disappointed.

ITALY, SPAIN

I pair these together for both are battling for Europe's centre stage. However trust me and in Italy, instead of Barolo look for the powerful red Sagrantino variety from Umbria and Primitivo from Puglia and for white the re-emergence of some excellent Soave as well as the wonderful Turbiana grape of Lugana. Spain's emerging regions offer fantastic value. Look at Godello instead of cost-rising Albariño and for a new world of red options: Bierzo, Madrid, Montsant and Navarra. And do look at any colour from the top producers of Penedès.

PORTUGAL

Across Spain's border Portugal's indigenous varieties - from the North: Duero, Bairrada & Dão serve up rich, hearty reds whilst further south, the Alentejo region is the rising star in white, rosé and reds.

SOUTH AFRICA

Parity wise, the Cape's offerings are holding up and South Africa will prove excellent value. Add to this increased plantings of Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc – a look at this section is a must.

SOUTH AMERICA

Pound for pound I have maintain for years one cannot top Chile's range of offerings of good reliable alternatives which now include wonderful Syrah and, of course, the 'native' Merlot-like Carménère. The same can very much be said of Argentina, dominated by Malbec's success you should not ignore the many other varieties produced including their much-improved white Torrontés. Brazil is South America's eye-catcher with some excellent fizz, white and reds – give them a go, you'll be pleasantly surprised.

AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND

Here's the opposite to South Africa, a strong currency and shipping costs have realised highest import increases. However, New Zealand's must-have Sauvignon Blanc will prevail for the foreseeable future and keep an eye for fabulous slate-dry Rieslings from Australia's Clare and Eden Valleys.

USA

Wines here have always been, cost-wise, on the 'up' side but some truly great stuff is shipped this way. Before paying out, how about giving the wines of Fingers Lake (New York) and Richmond, Virginia a spin – you'll be in for a pleasant and different surprise.

My apologies to regions and countries omitted.

I thus close this very brief summary and as I raise a glass for a healthy, happy and hopefully, a prosperous New Year, please do feel free to contact me for any information.







A WELCOMING SOCIAL CLUB IN THE CITY OF LONDON WITH LEADENHALL MARKET AT ITS HEART.

Lime Street is one of 25 wards in the City of London, each electing an alderman to the Court of Aldermen and Commoners (the City equivalent of a councillor) to the Court of Common Council of the City of London Corporation. Only electors who are Freemen of the City of London are eligible

to stand. The Lord Mayor of London for 2006-07, John Stuttard, is its current alderman.

Even within the Ward Clubs there seems to be differing versions of the reason for their creation – albeit the underlying themes do not change. The majority were probably formed in the mid/ late 19th C when more and more people become commuters to and from the city, rather than residents. Membership was encouraged from both those residing in the City of London and those who came to work in the City. Most Ward Clubs historically had an interest in both social events and promoting awareness/ involvement in the City's administration and electoral process.

Today there are 23 Ward Clubs including Lime Street (founded in 1946). They provide an excellent opportunity to:

- learn more about the City and civic life
- meet the men and women making the decisions about how the City is run
- get to know our elected representatives
- attend some excellent formal and informal social events.

For anyone interested in becoming more involved with City life both civic and social the Ward Clubs are the best possible introduction.

There is one other specific Club that should be mentioned, The United Wards' Club. In response to Ward boundary changes in 1877, Joseph Newbon decided to set up a club so that members of various wards could continue to meet together. The first meeting was held on 31st Oct 1877.
